### Snowboarders Get Ready!

#### Time To Ride!

If you are a 4th, 5th or 6th grader you can now try snowboarding! Visit the ESSC website - Junior Programs to learn more about each level and the skills that will be taught!

**First Timers:** Practice putting on your boots, this includes tying them tightly. Next, practice strapping your boots to your board with your bindings; and then loosening the straps and stepping out. Need equipment? We can provide snowboard equipment for the first time rider so you can try the sport out!

**All Riders:** Take your board to a local shop to get tuned and waxed. Tighten all screws on your bindings. Make sure you have a complete set of clothing that fits (helmet, goggles, gloves, snow pants, and jacket). Watch some snow-boarding videos to refresh your memory on riding skills.

### **Coming Full Circle**

There is a familiar name behind the scenes for the ESSC Equipment Committee. ESSC alum and lifelong supporter, Ben Drummond (Ben was the Palmer trophy winner in both 5th and 6th grades), moved from Head to Rossignol in 2016 and as the New England Sales Rep he facilitates the clubs equipment purchases and warranty claims for Rossignol and Lorpen.

Through our continued partnerships with Rossignol and Lorpen, we were able to update a significant portion of our boot inventory as well as continue the ski sock program for our participants who rent from the club. The students, parents, and teachers all raved about this addition to our rental program 3 seasons ago, but the ones who continue to be the happiest, are our volunteer boot fitters.

These volunteers fit more than 400 pairs of boots and socks in 1 week every December, and are getting ready to do it again this year, with smiles knowing that there will be clean, dry socks for everyone.





# Red Parka Challenge Cup

#### New Records, New Gates and New Goals

The 43<sup>rd</sup> annual Red Parka Pub Challenge Cup was a major success, combining with "Skier Appreciation Night" to raise over \$11,000 for ESSC, and become the clubs top fundraiser in 2016. It is hard to believe that there was discussion of making the 40<sup>th</sup> annual Challenge Cup the last due to decreasing participation. Luckily for the club the resurgence of racer interest has driven a commitment to continue the race indefinitely, and the return of The World Pro Skiing Tour in 2017 has provided the committee with the opportunity to update our battered starting gates.

In 2015 Doug MacDonald, a Jr. Program alum and Challenge Cup legend, dealt the 30-year old, custom made, starting gates their final barge. Luckily in 2016, ESSC Board Member & USSA Timer Matt Howard was asked if he knew of a Race that would be able to test the prototype of the new starting gates for The World Pro Skiing Tour, and the race he suggested was The Challenge Cup. After the race this year, the participants and race workers all agreed that the new gates were far more reliable and started a separate fund raising effort at the awards party to purchase a set of new start gates. Matt Howard and Terry O'Brien have raised more than half of the funds needed for these new gates and are continuing to work to raise the rest of the funds.

This season as we start to prepare to host the 44<sup>th</sup> Annual Challenge Cup and start to look towards the 50<sup>th</sup>, Terry set a new goal for the race: raise more than \$15,000 for ESSC. The race is restricted to the first 175 entries; in 2016 we had 122 racers, so make sure that you get your registration in early this year. If your racing days are behind you, there is always a need for volunteers and sponsors, and plenty of room at the bump for spectators. The 44<sup>th</sup> Annual Red Parka Pub Challenge Cup is slated for Saint Patrick's Day, Friday March 17, 2017 at Attitash.
